Los buques de línea fueron una herramienta decisiva en el desarrollo de la sociedad industrial durante casi un siglo y medio. El Titanic aparece en el ecuador de este periodo histórico, cuando estas naves eran más necesarias y lo hace como el buque más grande y más lujoso que jamás había existido. Una serie de imprudencias y un accidente inesperado durante su viaje inaugural, llevaron al buque al fondo del océano la madrugada del quince de abril de 1912, junto a las vidas de más de 1500 personas. El naufragio del Titanic produjo una gran conmoción, hasta el punto que un siglo después sus ecos aun resuenan. Gracias a una inteligente campaña publicitaria, aquel barco reunió una nutrida representación de las mayores fortunas de la época, que deseaban participar en la inauguración de un buque extraordinariamente notable. Junto a ellos

habitaban el gran navío una mayoría de pasajeros humildes, que en aquellas décadas emigraban a América en masa, huyendo del hambre y de una Europa convulsa y decadente. Un accidente inesperado y un naufragio que nadie creía posible les obligaron a compartir, en condiciones muy desiguales, la certeza de una muerte cercana y la soledad de la noche, en medio de un inmenso océano. Los intereses creados exageraron el aspecto sensacionalista de aquel naufragio, intentando ocultar las verdaderas causas que lo habían producido. Las páginas que siguen pretenden exponer los hechos que dieron lugar a esta tragedia e intentan dotar al drama de este buque mítico de una perspectiva histórica, analizando la trayectoria de sus precursores y de los que le siguieron, hasta que la aviación certificó el final de una época y de una auténtica filosofía de vida.

Los grandes naufragios españoles

This collection of 17 remarkable maritime stories stretches from 1752 to 2005, across several countries, and features warships and merchantmen, steam and sail, the humble and the prestigious. Encompassing the major causes of maritime disaster war, weather, navigation, human failings and technology it highlights the themes and qualities that make maritime drama so compelling- and it dares to challenge the popular perception of the Titanic as the greatest shipwreck story of all time. The drunken captain of an unseaworthy ferry who refuses to return to port in bad weather because he would have to refund the fares; the naval captain who entrusts the navigation of his frigate to a passenger; the crew who callously ignored freezing survivors on a dismantled wreck; the passengers who seriously believed a ship could be unsinkable. But for every instance of cruelty, criminal negligence and bad luck over the past 250 years there is another of courage, leadership, humanity and sheer audacity- the Americans who went to save the crew of the Squalus submarine trapped at a depth beyond the capability of any previous rescue equipment; the French fisherman who swam through heavy seas to a convict ship in distress; the German commander who risked his life and his U-boat to help survivors; the Spaniard who used his bowsprit as a lifeline. It brings dramatic stories, some barely known outside their own countries, some inexplicably neglected in their own, to vivid life and asks the question- what are the ingredients of a great maritime drama?

Naufragios (Spanish Edition)

Once seen as a prediction of the sinking of the Titanic, *The Wreck of the Titan* was written fourteen years before that ill-fated event of 1912. Now, on the centenary anniversary of the sinking, the striking similarities between the fate of the Titan and Titanic can be examined again in this new edition. In this 1898 novella, John Rowland, a disgraced former Royal Navy lieutenant, has taken employment as a lowly deck hand aboard the largest ship ever to have sailed, the Titan. One night in deep fog in the North Atlantic, the Titan strikes a gigantic iceberg and sinks almost immediately. The foreword is by Sam Leith, who has examined chance and coincidence in his novel, *The Coincidence Machine*.

Come Hell & High Water

The Wreck of the Titan

These call into question the scenario in William Cowper's famous poem, "On the Sinking of the Royal George," which depicts Kempenfelt writing in his cabin when she foundered.

Catastrophe at Spithead

Violet Jessop's life is an inspiring story of survival. Born in 1887 in Argentina, the eldest child of Irish immigrants, at the age of 21 she became the breadwinner for her widowed mother and five siblings when she commenced a career as a stewardess and nurse on some of the most famous ocean going vessels of the day. The volume is illustrated with engravings and maps, contemporary with the manuscript, from the Russian/Soviet and East European collections of the New York Public Library. 300 Jahre Robinson Crusoe
